Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Daniel 6.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 7/18/16 – 7/23/16: Parting of the Red Sea, Exodus 14.

Monday, July 18, 2016

Read: Exodus 14.

Reflect:

The Israelites were obedient to God and left Egypt only to find themselves facing another dilemma: the Egyptians regretted allowing them to leave and began to chase them.

When have you obeyed God and found yourself in a difficult situation?

What was God's purpose for the Israelites?

Is He using you in the same way He used Israel? How so?

Are there steps of faith you're avoiding because they may cost you something? What steps? What cost?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

What would you tell an unbeliever about why you obey God?

Why you trust God?

Why would you obey when it may involve some risk or sacrifice?

Tuesday, July 19, 2016

Read: Exodus 14:13-14, Joshua 1:9, Psalm 46:10.

Reflect:

Why did the Israelites need to be reminded to "stand firm" and "be silent"?

When do you need a similar reminder? Why?

What have been the consequences of your fear and doubt?

What have been the consequences of your faith, trust, and obedience?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Journal about a time you were reluctant to allow God to be in control. How did your situation resolve? Consider sharing that story with someone if it might build them up or inspire them with the good news of God's redemption.

Wednesday, July 20, 2016

Read: Exodus 14:4, 18, 31; Joshua 2:10; Psalm 50:15.

Reflect:

God has no egotistical need to be glorified, so why is it important for you and for others to "know that [he is] the Lord?" (vv. 4, 18).

How has your life's adversity honored God?

How do you honor and glorify God?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Glorifying God and declaring him as Lord is important for our faith, but giving him glory may also be used in the lives of others. Commit to glorifying God in word and deed with a person you know you'll encounter this week. Write your plan here.

Thursday, July 21, 2016

Read: Exodus 14:29-31; 15:1-2, 13-15.

Reflect:

The story of the crossing of the Red Sea is not simply an account of a miraculous solution for escaping the Egyptians.

What other Biblical ideas or imagery are represented by the crossing of the Red Sea?

Page through the other stories in Exodus (the plagues and Passover; the departure from Egypt; the provision of quail, manna, and good water; the defeat of the Amalekites; the establishment of the Tabernacle; and the giving of the Ten Commandments). What themes run through the entire book?

How does the story of Israel in Exodus mimic your story as a child of God?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Find an opportunity to mention to someone your study this week of this (or another) "famous" Bible story. Can you tie the redemption of the world through Christ to this story of the redemption and deliverance of Israel?

Friday, July 22, 2016

Read: Exodus	14:8, 14,	23-29; E	phesians 2	2:1-3;	Romans	8:31-33.
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Reflect:

What is chasing you down (as Pharaoh chased the Israelites)?

How can you respond when you feel "pursued" by the world, the flesh, or Satan? (hint: Read Psalms 50:15 and 46:10)

Adversity, personal sin, grief, and other setbacks and challenges may confront you every day. What can you tell yourself or others when facing these?

From where or from whom do you draw your comfort in the midst of trials? Why?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Write four Bible verses that give comfort. Who else needs to hear those this week?

Saturday, July 23, 2016

Read: Exodus 14; 1 Corinthians 10:1. Reflect: The crossing of the Red Sea (along with other stories in Exodus) is a prominent Bible story. It's celebrated in many other areas of the Bible, in secular films, at summer camps, and during Sunday school series. Journal here about what this story has meant for your spiritual formation: What are the most important messages you read from this passage of Scripture? How would you restate the *meaning* of the Exodus 14 passage? Its significance? Its application? What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

What will you share with others tomorrow?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week four of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, mixed, <u>invitation/service</u>. Each week will have an intergenerational element (such as the meal); then there will be a focus for the meeting that follows the pattern and is attentive to God's Word and the age mix.

Prepare:

The Exodus story is a powerful account of how God saved the people of Israel. There are parallels between our story and the Israelites' story: The people of Israel were saved from the Egyptians' enslavement, and those of us who have accepted Christ have been saved from sin and live in freedom. Scripture invites us to celebrate this freedom we've been given.

Invitation/Service:

A while back, the Woodmoor campus had a day dedicated to cleaning up the church. It was a great time to get to know new folks and have fun with friends. It was also great to have the opportunity to make sure our building was in a state that would bless our community and visitors. I'd like to invite you, your family, or your Base Camp to ask one of our campus pastors if there's something you can help with for a day or an ongoing basis at our church. There are plenty of outside and inside projects that would be a blessing to our church and to our community.


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Mission and Vision
