Following a clear call from the Lord, Dan and his wife of 25 years, Esmé, moved their family to Colorado Springs in 2014. Prior to calling our community "home," Dan completed a 24-year career as an officer and test pilot in the Air Force. He also

served as an elder-in-training at Central Christian Church in Lancaster, California, where he led adult Bible study and discipleship groups for many years. His passion is investing in people through the love of Jesus. A quiding Bible passage is Hebrews 10:24-25, "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one anotherand all the more as you see the Day approaching." He views caring for and equipping the Body at The Ascent Church as a precious stewardship. Both he and Esmé take the role of ambassador for Christ seriously (but with a smile), whether in their local neighborhood or in their service with the military discipleship ministry of The Navigators (where Dan serves as Deputy Director). Dan also brings his leadership experience and heart to develop people, into consulting work as a leadership trainer and coach. His most important coaching centers around their two children: Josh (18) and Anna (13). One of Dan's greatest joys and privileges as a father was baptizing each of his children as followers of Jesus. He recognizes that this milestone is just a first step to maturing in the faith, a process that every believer should enter into with lifelong commitment and lifelong community. As Dan states, "We grow in supportive circles, not isolated islands or passive rows."

God's SHAPE for you:				
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Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways—as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings—and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity— God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passage for January 23 – January 28, 2017:

Nehemiah 9:38-10:39

Monday, January 23, 2017

Read Nehemiah 9:38–10:39 several times, using different versions. If you have time, read the earlier chapters of Nehemiah to gain the context for this passage.

Reflect

What was your initial reaction when you read about the commitments asked of the people?

Note the three groups of leaders mentioned in this passage. What are the differences between these various groups?

This was written at a time when the Israelites were operating in a theocracy, and this was a civil society commitment. What similarities and differences do you see between this and what happens in today's churches?

Why do you think it's important for groups of people to make serious and substantial commitments for the good of their communities?

Tuesday, January 24, 2016

Read Nehemiah 9:38–10:39 again. Before you read this passage, ask God to guide your thoughts to what He wants to show you.

Reflect

What questions arose in your mind as you reread the passage today? How might you go about getting answers to those questions?

Within our church, which groups of people might be equated with the following:

Our leaders

Our Levites

Our priests

In verse 29 it says the people bound themselves with "a curse and an oath." What do you think the curse and oath were?

If you were to categorize the various commitments the people were asked to make, what general categories would you place them in?

Wednesday, January 25, 2016

Read Nehemiah 10:30–39 today. Spend time thinking about the commitments asked of the people.

Reflect

If you had been one of these Israelites, which of the commitments would have been the most challenging for you?

What might be equivalent commitments you're asked to make today?

What do you think was meant by the summary statement in verse 39: "We will not neglect the house of our God"?

In our society today, what are ways we neglect the house of our God?

Thursday, January 26, 2016

Read Nehemiah 9:38–10:39. Ask God to reveal what He expects as your commitment to your local body of believers this year.

Reflect

Making commitments or "oaths" is a vital part of your life in Christ. Reflect on the following passages, and journal what you hear from God.

Deuteronomy 10:12-22

Matthew 5:33-37

Proverbs 20:25

Psalms 76:11

Psalms 116:13-19

Friday, January 27, 2016

Read Nehemiah 9:38–10:39. Consider all the names listed in the beginning verses of this passage.

Reflect

Why do you think the names of the Israelite leaders were recorded so they could be read by future generations?

What effect might these commitments have on the community?

Spend time in prayer and fasting today. Reflect on commitments you would be willing to make in support of your church so that you might aid in its impact on community. Ask God what He wants you to commit to. Record this below.

Saturday, January 28, 2016

Reflect

Take some time to reflect on what you've learned after hearing from God this week. Is there something you feel God is asking you to do?

As you prepare for worship tomorrow, ask God to speak to you regarding the commitments that Pastor Rusty is asking the congregation to make as individuals and as a church body.

Share with a friend any commitments you're willing to make. Ask this friend to hold you accountable for fulfilling these commitments.

Spend time praying for the Ascent Church. Ask God to help the church fulfill its mission in the northern El Paso county region, and ask Him to show you what your individual part should be in this mission.

Building Our Base Camp Family

Prepare

After Sunday's worship service, send an email to your Base Camp reminding them of the commitments Pastor Rusty asked for in his sermon.

Intergenerational Element

Gather as a large group. Ask younger members what is the most significant promise they have made and what helps them keep that promise. Reflect on the promises made at baptism (promises to turn to Jesus, renounce evil, confess sin, and follow Jesus for the rest of their lives.) Discuss which promises are easy and which prove to be more difficult. Conclude with a small renewal of these promises in prayer.

Adult Study

Read Nehemiah 9:38–10:39 and discuss the questions below. End with a shared commitment to the promises Rusty requested in worship.

In verses 28–29, what is the language of their commitments?

Why is there both a commitment and a curse as a part of these vows?

What kinds of commitments did all make?

- Verse 31a

- Verses 34
- Verses 35
- Verses 36-37

- Verse 31b
- Verses 32-33

What were the priests and Levites to do (verses 38–39)?

What is the summary phrase related to the sanctuary and temple?

How does this inform your support for the ministry of the church and the places you gather?

How do the commitments listed in chapter 10 connect to those Rusty asked of the church? What differences should these shared commitments make to your Base Camp purposes?
