# Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

## **Message Notes**

Sermon Passages: Luke 14:7-14.



#### **Shared Engagement and Preparation**

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

#### **Deep Engagement and Doable Application**

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

#### **Consistency Over Time**

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 6/27/16 – 7/02/16: 2 Corinthians 3:7-18.

## Monday, June 27, 2016

<b>Read:</b> Exodus 34:29-35.
Reflect: With what did Moses come down from the mountain?
Why do you think Moses veiled his face?
Exposure to the glory of God was shown in Moses' face, and that glory was hidden behind a veil. Where else was the glory of God hidden behind a veil?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

## Tuesday, June 28, 2016

Read: Exodus 26:30-37 and Leviticus 16:2.
Reflect: What did the veil separate in the Tabernacle and Temple?
What was behind the veil?
What would happen if you were exposed to God's glory behind the veil?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

## Wednesday, June 29, 2016

Read: 2 Corinthians 3:7-18.
Reflect: Keeping in mind the Old Testament passages you read, list the significant imagery that is common to all passages.
What imagery would be familiar to a Jewish reader of the 2 Corinthians passage?
Are you able to begin putting Paul's analogy together as he teaches the difference between the Old Covenant (the Law), and the New Covenant (through the Spirit)?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

## Thursday, June 30, 2016

Read: 2 Corinthians 3:12-16.
Reflect: What is the only way "the veil" is lifted today?
From what are you freed when the veil is lifted?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

## Friday, July 1, 2016

Read: 2 Corinthians 3:17-18.
Reflect: What do you have "where the Spirit of the Lord is"?
What does freedom look like to you?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

## Saturday, July 2, 2016

Read: Galatians 5.
Reflect: Galatians 5:1 talks about slavery. Slavery from what?
List or highlight some of the key ways a person in freedom lives.
Read the core passage again, 2 Corinthians 3:7-18, and see if you understand more clearly what Paul was trying to teach with regards to our freedom from the Old Covenant of the Law, and now life in the Spirit of the New Covenant in Jesus Christ.
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

#### **Building Our Base Camp Family**

This is week one of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: <u>intergenerational</u>, adult study, mixed, invitation/service.

Supplies: Several rolls of masking tape and sharpies.

Intergenerational: Try this activity to help understand how sin enslaves you, and how Christ breaks you free.

Partner up with a child: Have a child or adult make a fist with their right hand. Wrap a band of masking tape snugly around his/her closed fist, to secure fingers and thumb so they can't move. (Wrap it around a couple of times for older kids or adults.) Write the word "sin" all around the tape and explain that, without Christ, you are bound as a slave. Then ask your child to open his/her fist and shake your hand. Because of sin (the tape), they cannot shake your hand, nor can they lift an open hand to praise God. Explain when you trust in Christ, God breaks the power of sin in your life. As you say this, each partner breaks the tape to set the other's hand free. Leave it stuck to the back of the hand to illustrate that although you are set free, sin remains a part of your life. Now, ask someone to shake your hand again. Although you are set free from the bondage of sin, because sin remains, you must daily choose to use your freedom from sin to live for God.

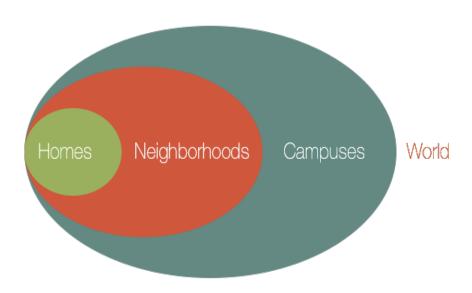
