Message Notes



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass begins devotions on Monday and leads up to the Sunday which will focus on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us, not biblical information itself. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's devotion. Rather, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on and seek growth; God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 11/23/15–11/28/15: Luke 2:10-11.

Read: Thanksgiving is Thursday, and Advent begins this Sunday. For many Christians, this week launches the most intense and joyful days of the Christmas holiday. In preparation, read Luke 2:1-20.

Reflect:

After reading the above verses from Luke, take a moment to think about the images that come to mind as you reflect upon this most familiar account of Christ's birth.

Pretend you have been asked to tell the story from Luke 2:1-20 to a child. Without looking at Scripture, tell the story aloud.

Reflect upon what you thought and felt as you read and told the story. Record these thoughts:

Tuesday, November 24, 2015

Read: Luke 2:10 in at least two translations.

Reflect:

Make a list of what could have been "good news" to the people living during the time of Jesus. Also, comment on what you believe brought "great joy" to them.

Make a list of what would be "good news" for you. What might bring "great joy"?

How is Jesus "good news," and how does Jesus bring "great joy?"

Wednesday, November 25, 2015

Read: Luke 2: 10-11 and Isaiah 9:2-6 in at least two translations.

Reflect:

Make a list of the ways Isaiah's prophecy parallels the declaration from the angel recorded by Luke.

Thursday, November 26, 2015

Read: Luke 2:10-11.

Reflect:

On this day of Thanksgiving, record brief responses to the following questions:

How is Jesus "good news" to you?

How does Jesus bring "great joy"?

Why are you grateful Jesus is your Savior and Lord?

Friday, November 27, 2015

Read: Luke 2:14 in at least two translations.

Reflect:

The angel declared "glory to God." What does this mean to you?

The angel declared "peace on earth." Explain what this implies.

The angel declared "peace on earth among those with whom he (God) is pleased." Journal your feelings about this statement.

Saturday, November 28, 2015

Read: Luke 2:1-20.

Reflect:

Tomorrow begins Advent. Advent is an ancient practice by Christians for the purpose of reflecting upon the prophecies of the Messiah. For several weeks Christians commemorate His incarnation and birth. Do you have a plan for observing Advent?

As Christmas day approaches, how will you use the days ahead to prepare your heart and mind to celebrate Jesus?

What might you do to bear witness to the "good news" of Jesus and the "great joy" He brings during this season of Advent?

Building Our Base Camp Family

Prepare:

Do a web or other search for depictions of Jesus; either save the search on a tablet for all to see, or print off the top 15-20 images.

Intergenerational:

Open in prayer as you begin a season of preparation for Christmas, the season of Advent. If you are using an Advent Wreath, make the devotion appropriate for all ages.

- With the images from Preparation, have children and teens categorize the emotions of Jesus. Research shows four or six fundamental emotions: Anger/Disgust, Fear/Surprise, Sadness and Joy.
- Ask: Which emotions to these images tell us Jesus had, and most frequently? When you imagine Jesus, how often do you imagine him in great joy? Why so?
- Does happiness or great joy sound like a needed gift in your life? In the life of others? Why?
- Read Luke 2.10-11 and reflect on what the advent (coming) of Jesus is meant to produce.

Adult or Adult/Teen time:

Read Luke 2.8-15:

- What is significant about the messengers of this announcement of "good news"?
- Was fear the shepherds only reaction to angelic visitation, or was it also a reality in their world? Is fear a reality in your world?
- · What offset the fear of the shepherds?

Read Hebrews 2.14-18 and 2 Timothy 1.5-14

- What in Luke and these passages is meant to offset your fear?
- · How are we to commend the faith within us? How can
- we make this a spiritual practice for Advent?
 - In so committing our fears, how are we, then, messengers of this same good news?

Conclude with a time of prayer for one another and for those God calls us to share good news.

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
