


The Ascent Church Elder

Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Luke 11:37-44, Luke 24:1-8, 1 Peter 3:18-22.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 3/27/16–4/2/16: Job 8:21, Psalm 16:6, Romans 15:13, Psalm 139:7-10, Philippians 1:27 and 4:23.

Monday, March 28, 2016

Read: Job 8:21, Psalm 50:15, and Proverbs 15:13.
Reflect: When have you needed the return of laughter and joy to your life?
What were your prayers to God in that time?
How did He answer?
How did restoration of laughter and joy impact you? Others?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
Think about how God has given you joy or laughter in life. How could you share that with others this week?
What life events will require joy and laughter this week? How could you bring that to the table?

Tuesday, March 29, 2016

Read: Psalm 16:6, Psalm 50:23, and Proverbs 17:22.
Reflect: Why is it sometimes difficult to see the "boundary linesin pleasant places" or the "delightful inheritance" in our lives?
What gives you eyes to see the "pleasant" and "delightful" even in hard times?
How do God's blessings to you also bless others?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
How are you uniquely talented? How does this bless others?
Make a plan to use your gifts to bless others this week.
Thank God for the privilege to serve Him this way.

Wednesday, March 30, 2016

Read: Romans 15:13.

Reflect:

What is the cause and effect in this verse? Who or what produces what?

How do we hinder the work of the Holy Spirit?

Consider the effect of hope in our lives. This verse and those before it talk about hope. Hope is grouped with faith and love in 1 Corinthians 13—it's something we value greatly. How can we participate in the work of the Holy Spirit when it comes to developing hope?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

The hymn Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing talks about raising an Ebenezer stone—remembrance of and motivation for hope in God. It reads:

"Here I raise mine Ebenezer; hither by thy help I'm come; and I hope, by thy good pleasure, safely to arrive at home. Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God:

He, to rescue me from danger, interposed his precious blood."

How can you be a living "Ebenezer stone" this week?

Thursday, March 31, 2016

Read: Psalms 139:7-10.

Reflect:

The *Practice of the Presence of God*, by Brother Lawrence, speaks about Brother Lawrence's regard for God's presence:

"...having resolved to make the love of God the end of all his actions,...he was pleased when he could take up a straw from the ground for the love of God, seeking Him only, and nothing else, not even His gifts. That in order to form a habit of conversing with God continually, and referring all we do to Him; we must at first apply to Him with some diligence: but that after a little care we should find His love inwardly excite us to it without any difficulty."

David tells us God is in all things; Lawrence sees God's love even in picking up a "straw from the ground."

Is it a comfort or a challenge that God is in every place and every moment? Why?

How does God's omnipresence impact your daily living?

What do you do to seek or acknowledge God's presence?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Do you know anyone or any circumstances full of despair, lacking hope, lacking joy or lacking purpose? How can you encourage or share God's presence in those situations this week?

Friday, April 1, 2016

Read: Phillipians 1:27 & 4:23.

Reflect:

Describe what it means to "conduct yourself in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ":

Paul here is actually writing about opposition to the church—and how to face it. What do you consider a Christ-like response to opposition?

Where do you face such opposition?

When are you most challenged in your Christian witness or behavior?

What impact (positive or negative), might your response have on others? On you?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Think of a Christian brother or sister who needs to be encouraged and inspired to live out the gospel of Christ. How can you help them "stand firm in one spirit" this week?

Saturday, April 2, 2016

Read: Job 8:21, Psalm 16:6, Romans 15:13, Psalm 139:7-10, Phillipians 1:27, Phillipians 4:23, and Acts 1:8.

Reflect on the following:

This week's verses covered many topics concerning what we know, how we behave and how we feel about God. None are possible without the power of the Holy Spirit.

What beliefs (and/or doubts) do you have about the Holy Spirit's work in your life?

What spiritual practices invite the work of the Holy Spirit in your life? What do we do that quenches the Holy Spirit?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Worship and fellowship on Sunday and in Base Camp are certainly opportunities to study and celebrate what we know, what we feel, and what we do as God's children. What topic(s) from this week are you excited to meditate on or discuss during Sunday service or during Base Camp? What will you try to improve? What will you share?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week one of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: <u>intergenerational</u>, adult study, mixed, invitation/service. Each week will have an intergenerational element (such as the meal); then there will be a focus for the meeting that follows the pattern and is attentive to God's Word and the age mix.

Prepare: Items needed include a bowl of jelly beans and a Twister spinner (from the popular game). On the Twister spinner, tape a jelly bean on each of the dots, using only five colors of jelly beans. (If you do not have a spinner, instruct each person to pick one of the five colors when it is her/his turn).

Intergenerational:

Take turns spinning (adults, too), and when you land on the color, pick up that jelly bean and answer the questions below. You can eat the jelly bean after you answer the question!

Yellow jelly bean - How do you choose joy each day? When is it hard to choose joy?

Red jelly bean - What are some things you can do to remember that God is with you all the time? Have you ever had a time when God carried you through something really difficult?

Green jelly bean - What are some things you are hopeful for? Explain what the word "hope" means to you.

Purple jelly bean - How can other people see Jesus living in you? Tell about a time when you saw the Holy Spirit working in someone else's life.

Orange jelly bean - What does the word "gratitude" mean? What are the little things in life that you are grateful for?

Enjoy the jelly beans together!


