Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Genesis 2:2-3, Exodus 20:8-11, Mark 2:27, and Matthew 12:1-8.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 9/5/16 – 9/10/16: Deuteronomy 31:1-6.

Monday, September 5, 2016

| Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6. |
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| Reflect: As the Israelites prepared to enter Canaan, they certainly had hopes and dreams, as well as doubts and fears. |
| What hopes and dreams are drawing you into God's kingdom plan? |
| What is your "Canaan?" |
| How will you enter this "promised land?" Who will help you as you enter? |
| What doubts and fears might limit you? |
| Write a prayer praising God for His "promised land" plan for you. Meditate and reflect on how to glorify Him as you step into His will |
| What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice? |

Tuesday, September 6, 2016

| Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6; Deuteronomy 30:15-16. |
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| Reflect: Joshua would carry on the work begun by Moses. |
| What work are you continuing? |
| What is the purpose of this work? |
| Who has gone before you? |
| Will you lead or are you being led? What does this mean for you as you participate in God's plan? |
| Thank God for taking you from "Egypt to the Promised Land." Meditate on what He's called you to. Is it a challenge? A privilege? An opportunity? |
| What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice? |

Wednesday, September 7, 2016

Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6; Numbers 13:26-30; Hebrews 13:5.

Reflect:

Why do you need a reminder that He "will never leave you nor forsake you?"

As the Israelites wandered in the desert, they so often forgot God's past provision and the promised future He foretold.

What is the past provision and the promised future of your life in God?

What "powerful people" or "fortified cities" do you face in your personal life, in your community group, or as a church body?

Discuss the "powerful people" and "fortified cities" you face with a fellow believer. Pray together and support one another as you proceed into your "Promised Land."

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Thursday, September 8, 2016

Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6; 1 Samuel 16:7-13; Matthew 4:18-22.

Reflect:

David was chosen from a humble position in life; Jesus selected men of lowly position to be His apostles.

What does God's selection of leaders say about those leaders? About God?

Considering David's subsequent failures and the disciples' doubt and abandonment of Jesus, what does this mean for you as a follower of God's appointed leaders?

In general, how will you follow and support the leaders God has appointed in your life?

List some specific ways you will support and follow the leaders God places in your life.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Friday, September 9, 2016

Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6; Colossians 3:12-17; Philippians 4:2-3.

Reflect:

Like the Israelites taking on a new leader (Joshua), the New Testament churches were challenged to ensure there was trust in God, support, unity, and love within their body.

What challenges face you today as a member, a leader, or a follower in a local church body?

What undermines good member-leader-follower relationships in a church body?

What blesses you as a member, leader, or follower in your church body relationships?

What pleases God as His people relate to each other in a local church?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you this week, and how might you put them into practice?

Saturday, September 10, 2016

Read: Deuteronomy 31:1-6; Hebrews 13:17.

Reflect:

This Deuteronomy passage is a rich illustration of trust in God, God's provision and the privilege and responsibility of leading God's people.

A change or transition in church leadership can challenge a church body, but God has left you with counsel.

What are God's promises to you, as one who participates in His kingdom through a local church body?

What are God's instructions to you, as a follower or supporting member in the local church body?

List some specific areas where obedience and authority might be in question in your life.

Pray for the Holy Spirit's counsel as you commit to God's will in those areas.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you this week, and how might you put them into practice?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

Prepare:

Early in the week contact your Base Camp and encourage them to prepare for this Sunday's sermon by studying the passage and using the Compass as a tool. Invite them to bring their copy of the Compass to your Base Camp gathering.

Intergenerational:

Students have recently transitioned to new teachers. Our congregation will soon transition to a new Lead Pastor. Before dismissing them to another activity, ask children of all ages to share their advice for how to begin with a new leader.

Adult Study:

Ask each adult to share their expectations, hopes, and desires for Rusty. How did studying Deuteronomy 31:1-6 impact their thoughts?

In Deuteronomy, Moses is largely recounting to Israel their time in the wilderness. In 8:1-3, how does God explain the reason for their time in transition?

- V3: How did God teach them what they needed to know?
- V2: What needed to be tested in God's people?
- V2: What command did God give in this verse?
- V1: For what territory was all the above?

Read Acts 15:7-21.

- How did new leadership reveal itself?
- How might this assist expectations of leaders in the church?

Conclude by praying for Rusty's first weeks in our area, as he begins his leadership at The Ascent Church. Record your prayers and review in 4 or 5 weeks and again in 4 or 5 months.


