Heaven's Interest Rate Base Camp Discussion Questions / Devotional

"I tell you the truth," Jesus replied, "no one who has left home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for me and the gospel 30 will fail to receive a hundred times as much in this present age (homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and fields—and with them, persecutions) and in the age to come, eternal life." Mark 10:29-30

The years from 2006 to 2008 were lean for us. At the time, we were pastoring a church in Atlanta when the housing crisis hit. The market crashed so precipitously that we lost all of our equity and even had to pay extra when we sold our home before we moved to Illinois. The loss was stunning, but not as bad as many of our friends. Some faced foreclosure in upside down loans and others were unable to sell at all due a tremendous drop in prices. We were thankful that, at least, we were able to sell our home before the market totally crashed.

There are no guarantees when it comes to investing in this world. Regardless of the market, the company's financials, or the stock's rating, tragedy can strike and our investments can fly away. Maybe that's why we have an eagle printed on our money. We live in a volatile age. This is not to say that we shouldn't make reasoned investments with our resources. It is wise to invest with the intention of increasing the provision God has provided. But there is only one investment that is immune to any downturn . . . our investment in the works of God. We actually store treasures in Heaven when we give to the Lord. And these treasures multiply. Notice Christ's words above where he gives a specific rate in reference to our heavenly investments. He says we will "receive a hundred times as much" on our return. This is equivalent to a ten thousand percent rate of return!

The return is promised to happen both now ("this present age") and in Heaven ("the age to come"). It also is directly related to the nature of the gift given. For example, if you give your home and fields to God, you will receive a hundred homes and fields in return. If you give your relationships (as in leaving family to serve God in another land, or being rejected by your family for serving God), you will receive a hundred similar types of relationships in return. The principle is clear: for every investment to God, a ten thousand percent return guaranteed!

This teaching was originally given in the context of a conversation Jesus had with a very wealthy man who had made money his idol. This rich man claimed He wanted to follow God, but when push came to shove, God took second place to his money. When we give to the Lord, we are stating "In God I trust."

Discussion Questions: Why is this so difficult for us to believe and practice this? What have you done to increase your standard of giving? What has been the blessing? What are you going to do, practically, to be more faithful in this area?

Discuss Mark 10:17-31 and its implications for this life and the next.
