Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways—as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings—and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passage for January 2 – January 7, 2017:

Luke 15

Monday, January 2, 2017

Read: Luke 14 and Luke 15:1.

In chapter 14, what stood out as the most compelling reason tax collectors and sinners were drawing near to Jesus?

Recall your conversion or coming to faith in Jesus. What did you see, hear, or experience God using to bring you to saving faith? If you have not yet become a believer, why not? What in this story connects with your story of faith?

Are you a received sinner or a proud saint? What difference does this answer make as you think about others who are far from Christ or do not yet believe?

Pray for one person in your neighborhood who doesn't know Christ as Savior. Pray for someone else you see regularly at work, the gym, coffee shop, or elsewhere who needs the hope of Jesus.

Tuesday, January 3, 2016

Read: Luke 15:1-10.

Who is Jesus' primary audience when He tells this series of parables? Who else is listening? Is there one message for "pharisees" and another for "sinners", or is there just one message of the Gospel?

Have you ever been fishing and lost your pole in the lake? Or had one of your many pets wander off? Is Jesus' example of a lost sheep relevant today? What in the human heart makes this true?

In verses 7 and 10 Jesus drives home a surprising point. Summarize in your own words.

For His primary and secondary audience, how might this point have impacted each group?

When do you find yourself more pharisee-like? More sinner-like?

Journal below times when you've been that one lost sheep? Journal what heaven's response to your repentance was. Find a Christian hymn, song, or poem that captures this for you and share it on social media/with a friend.

Wednesday, January 4, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32.
Summarize the younger son's actions in this passage.
How much do you identify with the younger son?
What caused you to "come to yourself" (v.17) and turn to God?
Is there a universal pattern for humanity in the younger son? What hope does this give for those you prayed for on Monday?
What do verses 20-24 indicate believers should do when someone comes to faith in Christ? How does this compare to 15:7 and 15:10?

Thursday, January 5, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32.
Summarize what the older son did in this passage.
How much do you identify with the older son?
The story ends without the older son "coming to himself". What caution does this give believers? To whom did Jesus expect to impact in this part of the parable?
Read Romans 2:4. As you think about your own sin life, are there real attitudes, behaviors, or vices that remain unconfessed? Confess them in prayer or journaling to God. Re-read all of chapter 15 as a way of shaping your heart towards Christ.
Remember the neighbors you prayed for on Monday. Re-read chapter 15 as a prayer for them.

Friday, January 6, 2016

Read: Luke 15:1-32 to refresh your memory.

The first two parables are usually titled by Bible publishers as "The Parable of the Lost Sheep" and "The Parable of the Lost Coin". What might be a more fitting title for verses 11-32 than the traditional "The Parable of the Prodigal Son"? (Note: the section titles many modern Bibles have are not part of the Bible itself, rather an interpretive guide from the publisher.)

Take a short inventory of the lost sheep, coins, and sons you are relationally close to and live physically close to. What might The Ascent Church do to help in your invitation to them? Send Scott an email at scott@theascentchurch.com with your thoughts.

What regular activity of The Ascent Church might you invite these people to? If none come to mind, pray for those near you.

Saturday, January 7, 2016

Read: Matthew 28:16-20.

You've studied the lost sheep, coin, and sons this week. Sometimes the mission of believers also gets lost. What have you learned this week that gives you hope as you re-emphasize bringing good news to the lost?

How might you shape your life to be more intentional in being a person of good news to those whom you come in contact with? How might you bless a neighbor, friend, or family member who needs the goodness of God's love, mercy, and encouragement?

What are you to teach others in order to make disciples? Is there anything the Lord has taught you that you are unable to teach others?

Pray for our church's mission as we start to climb together in 2017!

Building Our Base Camp Family

Preparation: Two days prior to your Base Camp meeting, send an email asking each participant (children/teens, too) to come prepared to share the names of one neighbor and one person from another local context (gym, coffee shop, work, etc) whom they want to see coming closer to Christ or coming to faith in Jesus. As the leader, review the Monday - Saturday pages; pick a favorite question or two.

Intergenerational Element: Sit in purposefully mixed groups at your Base Camp meal. Ask each person to share the names of those above and what they imagine coming closer to Christ would mean for their lives.

Adult Study: Read Luke 15. Catalog on a flip chart and discuss:

- What is similar in these three parables? In each, catalog
 if the character is representing God.
- In each parable, what did the character do that demonstrated the importance to God of finding the lost?
- In what ways have you pursued another coming to faith in Christ? What motivated you to share your faith?
- What opportunities shared in the sermon might you utilize to invite others to Ascent activities this year?

In groups of 3, pray for those you wish to impact. Come back together as a large group in prayer.

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
