At times we like to share the testimonies of some of the leaders that we are working with here in Tanzania and how the ministry is helping them fulfill their call from God. **Daniel is one of the head leaders in the new area where we will be expanding ministry this month**. Recently we were privileged to hear a bit of his testimony. Daniel's mother was Muslim and his father was Christian. In order to marry his mother his father converted to Islam. Daniel grew up learning the Koran and following the Muslim rituals. At around 8 yrs old his parents moved back to Kenya and left him in Tanzania with relatives. His relatives pushed Islam strongly on him and beat him if he did not comply. Eventually he ended up living on the streets as his extended family threw him out when they realized that even though was being beaten severely that he still chose to attend church. A local pastor had begun to feed him and just love on him as Christ would. Daniel eventually

accepted Christ and this caused a complete sever from all family communication. For Daniel and many in this area accepting Christ as the Son of God means losing almost everything else. It is not an easy choice. When I asked him what drew him from Islam to Christ he simply said that it was the love that he saw in the pastor and church members and how that contrasted with the hate that his family showed him. We have just finished training on disciples who make disciples with Daniel and the leaders in this area. He is eager to use what he is learning and growing in to reach youth who are out on the streets in similar situations to what he experienced.

Using the tools we are sharing with him I believe that he will have great impact on his community in spreading the good news of Jesus effectively. Please stand with us in prayer that

Daniel is led by the Lord as he reaches out to these youth on the street.

Since our arrival here, we have been building the works that God has us doing slowly, step by step, making sure the foundation

is strong. The Lord has us now in a season of sudden increase in ministry and influence. The foundation has held strong but a great sudden increase in attendance to the Ngarenairobi outreach and discipleship groups revealed some adjusting still remains to be done. In that area we went from consistently averaging 300 to 400 youth each month to a sudden increase to 800+. This spike in attendance allowed us to see where we need to still grow and develop. Since that time we have been implementing more training of the leadership team

and helping them grow by equipping them with the

tools needed to succeed at that level. While the numbers have not been that high this last month, we are aware that we are in a season of growing in ministry influence as well as personal

leadership development and are ready for the next time. We believe that God has allowed us to experience this sudden increase so that we could

see the growth needed and to refine the foundations, as this is where He is growing the ministry to, in the near future. We are receiving reports from many parents that their youth are showing change in their home

behaviors and have joy inside them.

These parents are now opening up to hearing the gospel that has brought change to their children.
