As summer fades into fall, I'm reminded that life moves in seasons too — each with its own challenges and quiet gifts. Right now, our home feels a little quieter, as Max is in the States for three weeks speaking at churches and visiting friends. I miss him, but I'm grateful he has this opportunity to connect, share, and be refreshed. Here in Ukraine, I'm holding down the fort, leaning into the slower pace, and trusting God's steady presence in it all.

What continues to move me is how this time fosters real discipleship. Whether it's around the campfire or during a morning Bible study, God uses this week to deepen relationships in ways that last long after camp ends.





At the end of this month, we'll have our first court hearing regarding Amelia. Right now, we have temporary emergency custody, but in the next 1–3 months, the judge will decide whether to terminate the birth mother's rights. Social services is recommending that they do.

Once we're granted full foster care, I'll finally be able to travel again — including the chance to visit home, which I've missed so deeply. It's been hard being away from family and unable to share with you face-to-face all that God is doing here. We would treasure your prayers for a smooth process and for God's peace to cover every part of it.

To be honest, this has been a stretching season. The past few years have brought so many big, painful events — things out of my control and beyond my strength.
