



6. What About Free Will?

a) Preliminary comments on the will(1) Free choice requires capability and desire

(2) One person's free choice does not, and cannot, rob another person of their free choice.

c) Sin corrupted and enslaved the will
(1) True freedom was lost to slavery to sin
(2) Free choice remained, yet with a will of rebellion

- Pushback on a Calvinistic View of Predestination

 a) Election is corporate, not individual
 (1) That is the case in some passages, but not all.
 (2) The corporate entity comprises of individuals.
 b) Doctrine of prevenient grace
 (1) Very difficult to support Biblically
 (2) Difficult to harmonize logically with other verses

 c) Personal experience

 (1) Scripture should interpret my experience. My experience should not interpret Scripture.
 - (2) Job learned that his "experience" was one small drop in the bucket of God's infinite wisdom and workings.



- d) Seems not fair
 - (1) With our limited knowledge and understanding, we are in no place to presume judgment on the One who holds all knowledge and understanding.
 - (2) By definition, the only part of this that is "not fair" is that any are saved at all.

(2) We cannot theologically rob God of His will in defense of our own.

f) Predestination means God creates people to send to hell.

- (1) The doctrine of predestination is not the problem. Hell is the problem.
- (2) Arminians have to explain how a good and loving God with all power lets His children run to hell.
- (3) Calvinists and Arminians alike have to deal

with the reality that people go to hell when He could prevent it.
