Pastor Jonathan's 'First Word' Article – July 2025

"How many persons of a particular denomination does it take to change a lightbulb?"

Charismatic: Only one. (*Hands are already in the air*.)

Pentecostal: Ten. (One to change the bulb and nine to pray against the spirit of darkness.)

Amish: What's a lightbulb?

Atheists: One. (But they are still in darkness.)

Methodists: Undetermined.

"Whether your light is bright or completely out, you are loved – you can be a light bulb, turnip bulb, or tulip bulb. Church-wide lighting service is planned for Sunday. Bring the bulb of your

choice and a covered dish."

Nazarene: Six. (One woman to replace the bulb while five men review church lighting policy.)

Presbyterian: Change?

"We've never done it that way before" is a common stereotype about many Christian communities, not just Presbyterians. That statement is full of fear, a fear of change and of life/ministry being different. There have been a number of changes over the past 18 months of my being here, and some of it has been very good and other change less so. The change in the size of the bulletin and having copies of hymn pages has been very good – as we have reduced our budget by at least \$500/year. The shift of community assistance to Tuesdays and Thursdays has opened time for staff and congregation to be intentional and interactive with those who need assistance – and that, too, is very good! The Session (ruling council) of FPCL has been engaged in exploring how we want to promote ourselves to Littleton extended community by our mission statement. The statement we have is beautiful – I do not think there is any debate – but it is not a mission statement. A mission statement directs our actions, and the Session has been clarifying what we believe God is calling us to do here and now (and we ourselves to Littleton extended community by our mission statement. The statement we have is beautiful – I do not think there is any debate – but it is not a mission statement. A mission statement directs our actions, and the Session has been clarifying what we believe God is calling us to do here and now (and we want to keep our current statement as a Vision Statement --- which well articulates what we believe!)

The talk of *change* often raises anxiety, but change is something I know you – even in your worry – can get excited about, and the excitement of possibility breaks the adage of "we've never done it that way before."

And I know you believe in change --- otherwise there would be no reason to worship the God of resurrection and new life. Our profession of faith tells of how we encounter the holiness of God and why we gather to worship God as a community of faith every Sunday.



We profess that as we learn more about God's good world, as we learn more about God's Word, and God's will for our lives, we change. One of the most powerful scripture passages about being change comes from Acts 9:13-15

¹³ But Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man (Saul), how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; ¹⁴ and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name." ¹⁵ But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel...

We often focus on Saul (*later known as Paul*) who encounters the Risen Christ on his way to Damascus, and Saul/Paul is changed from a persecutor of Followers of the Way (*early Christians*) to one proclaiming the salvation through Christ crucified and risen.

We often categorize this type of transformation as the pinnacle, the best work of God's Spirit. But there is another that is equally as powerful.

The change... the transformation of Ananias. He is changed from fear of death by Saul to seeking him out because the Word of the Lord changed Ananias.

That is how Christ changes us as well so we might participate in the "life that is truly life."

If you were to review your life, maybe especially the life of God's Spirit in you through FPCL, what has changed in you? How have you been transformed?

In other words, what is your testimony of God's work within you?

I firmly believe we all have a story and testimony, and even though Presbyterians "don't do it that way" often perhaps we need to more frequently. We need to share stories and testimony of God's work within and through us. I am convinced it will do 4 things (at a minimum):

Remind you of God's work within you

Share with others to enable them to recognize how God is (or might be) at work within them Celebrate the joy of God's Spirit at work within the community of faith that is FPCL

Give you words that are ready to share about why someone should accept your invitation for them to join you at worship of God at FPCL.

The telling of our stories, of how God is at work in and through us, is our own individual stories, just as each of our walks in faith are different so too is our potential for change. Saul/Paul was a Pharisee convinced of how he was right and was willing to kill for it, and his conversion or transformative story is impressive; our story does not need to be Saul/Paul's to be powerful. Our story needs to be the truth of how God is at work and will continue to transform us each day we open ourselves to God's Spirit.

May God's Spirit be at work within and through you,





Vacation Bible School 2025

Dear FPCL family—They say that Christmas is the "most wonderful time of the year", but for those of us fortunate enough to serve in Children's ministry, our annual week of Vacation Bible School is a close second! This year's VBS ran from Wednesday, May 28th through Saturday, May 31st, from 9am to noon each day. In addition, all of the VBS participants were invited back for worship at FPCL on Sunday, June 1st, where they sang a few of the songs they learned during the week, and then attended the churchwide picnic. The theme for this year's VBS was "Road Trip", with the key verse being Joshua 1:9—"The Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Each of the four days of VBS, children learned about how God is always present with us through studying a different Biblical "road trip." Lessons included Abraham and Sarah journeying to the Promised Land, the Exodus from Egypt, Jesus visiting the home of Zaccheus, and Paul's missionary journeys. Bible lessons were reinforced throughout the day as kids rotated through the different VBS stations. These included opening and closing celebrations in the sanctuary with music, team gatherings up on the fourth floor, crafts in Ficklin Hall, science experiments in the Windermere level classroom, Bible drama in the basement, and recreation out on the church lawn.

For VBS this year, we had a total of 22 participants, ranging in age from pre-K to 5th grade. We also had a wonderful group of adult and youth volunteers, who helped out with all aspects of the program, and without whom we simply could not have put together a ministry event of this magnitude. I want to recognize them here, and extend a special thank-you for all of their hard work, which in some cases started weeks, or even months beforehand! Each one of them chose to make a spiritual investment in the lives of young people, in the spirit of **Proverbs 22:6**, and for that, I'm extremely grateful!
