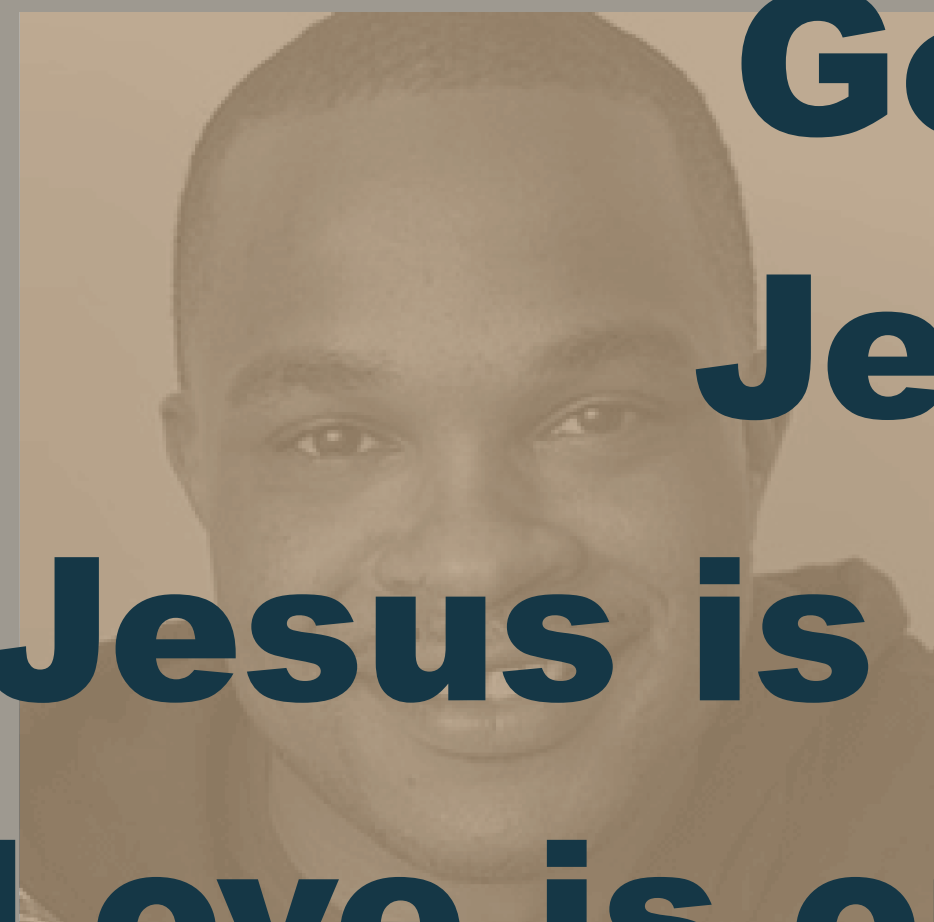


God is love. (Matthew 3:17, 1 John 4:8)

Jesus is love. (John 13:4, Hebrews 1:3)

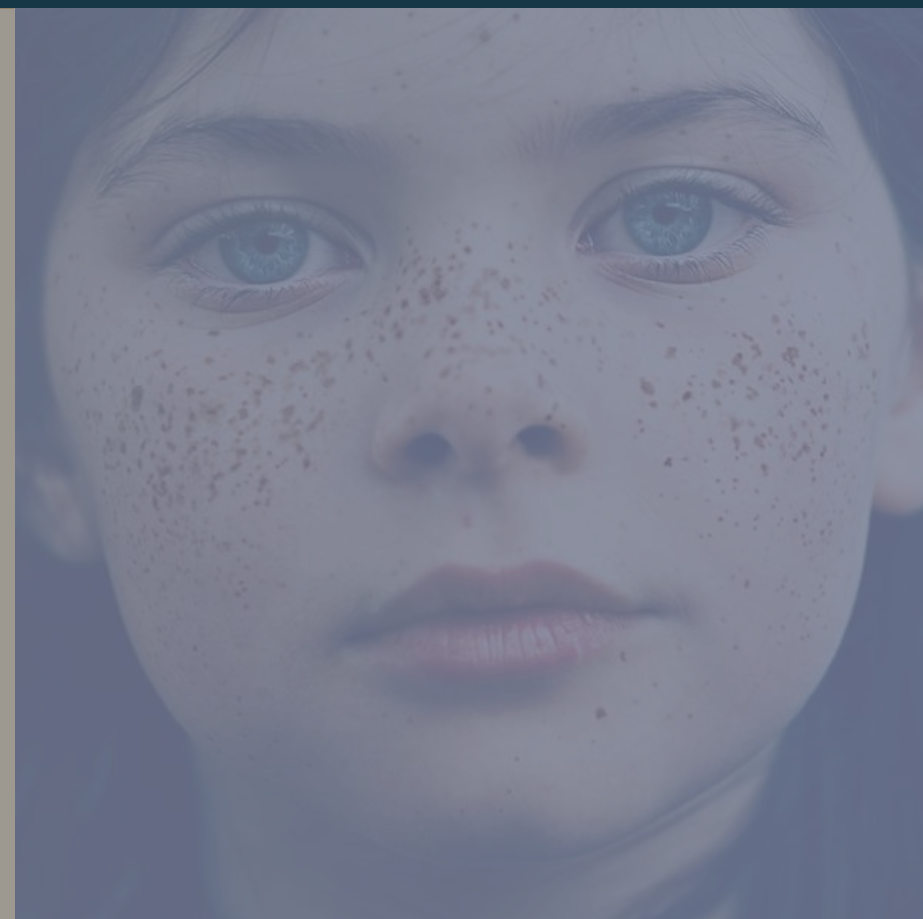
Jesus is motivated by love. (John 3:16, Romans 5:8)

My goal today is to prepare us as we embrace with excitement, the process to become love and to love fully.





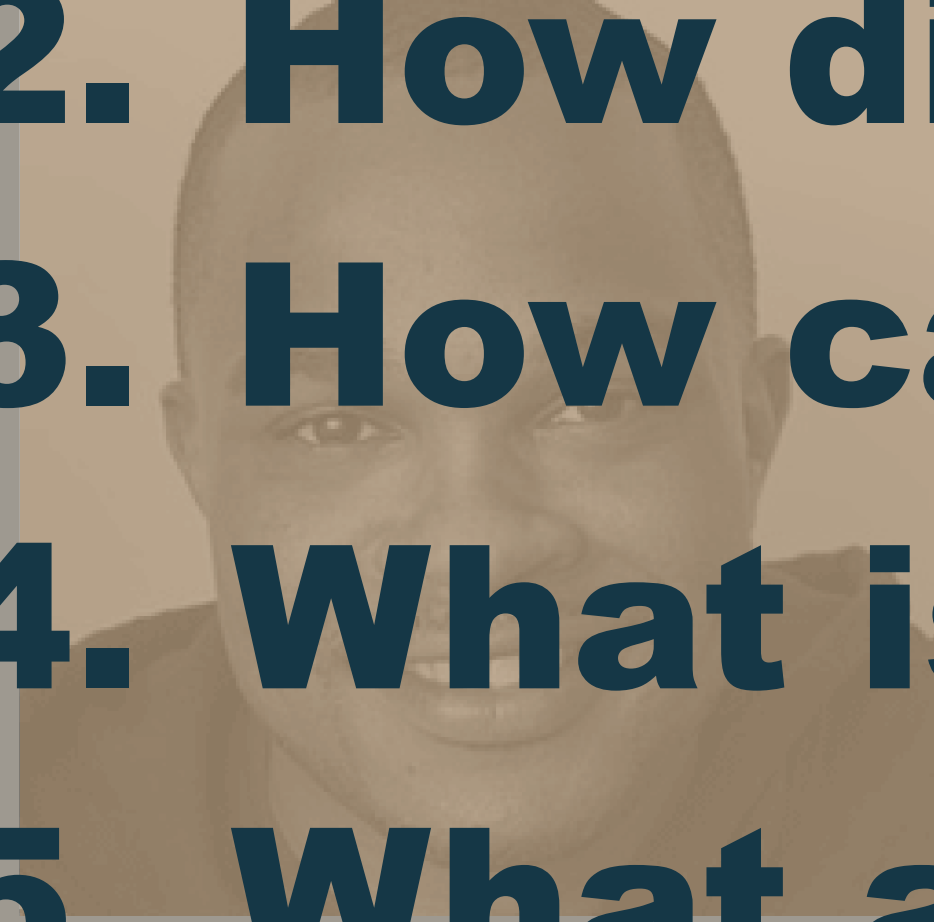

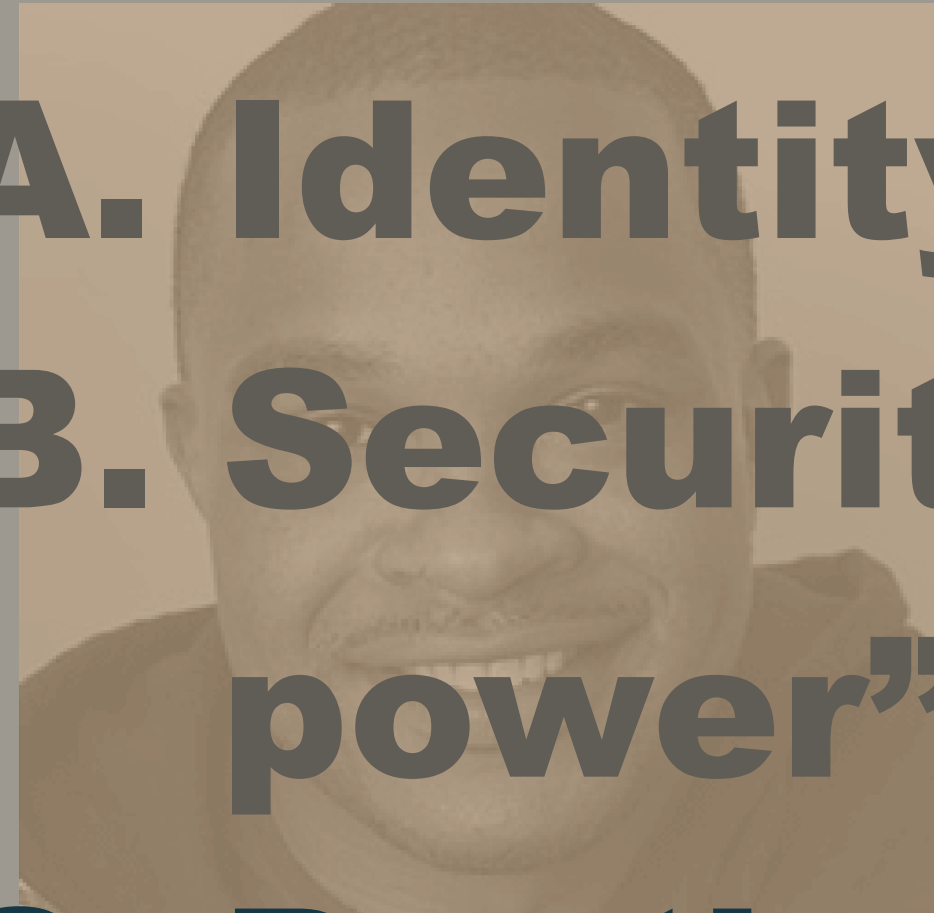
