In Greek these words are emphatic— it means, "by means," "certainly not," or "never." And the word "Me" in this verse is speaking of Jesus Himself.
So, the literal force of the phrase is: "You will by no means Me" It conveys absolute exclusion until the stated condition is met, which is,
till you say,
And what will the Jew say before they see Jesus again? They will cry out like others did on the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday (Matthew 21:9). They will say,
'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!'"
Romans 11:26 - "All Israel will be saved."
