They said to Him, 'Lord, that our eyes may be opened.'"
This is faith without —clear, direct, confident.
The Greek word for "opened" implies that they understood that this was something sized, that it would take divine intervention.
Folks, the man is blind, and the only one that can open eyes to see is JESUS.
Faith asks clearly and for what only Jesus can do.
The greatest need that people have is the need for spiritual sight.
6. Faith Receives and – Matthew 20:34
So Jesus had compassion and touched their eyes. And immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed Him.
The words for "had compassion" mean the of the inward parts, the twisting of the intestines. It's not pity; it's a visceral response that moves one to action.
Jesus could have healed with a word, but instead He them — a personal, tender act. And their response? They followed Him.
