The Bible reminds us that **Christmas is not about how _____ we give, but _____ we give.** In [Acts 20:35](#), the apostle Paul quotes Jesus: *“It is more blessed to give than to receive.”*

“And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.”

This verse tells us that the Wise men came to a _____. Next, we read, *“they saw the young child...”* It doesn’t say that they saw a “baby”, no, they saw a “_____ child”. We also know that King _____ ordered his soldiers to kill the male children in Bethlehem from two years old and younger ([Matthew 2:16](#)). Now, when the Wise men saw the “young child,”

The Gifts of the Wise Men

- _____ – Was a symbol of royalty and wealth ([Matthew 2:2](#)). Jesus was born King of the Jews; this gift affirms His royal status ([Psalm 2:6](#); [Revelation 19:16](#)).
- _____ – Was a symbol of worship and adoration ([Exodus 30:34](#)). Pictures Jesus' role as a priest ([Hebrews 4:14-16](#)). He was the mediator between God and man ([1 Timothy 2:5](#)).

- _____ – Was a symbol of suffering and death ([John 19:39-40](#)). A foreshadowing of Jesus' crucifixion and sacrificial death ([Isaiah 53:3-5](#)).
