613 Commandments
1. The Pharisees Together – 22:34
"But when the Pharisees heard that He had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together."
The Greek word for "silenced" is <i>phimoō</i> — meaning "to or make speechless."
1 Peter 2:15 reminds us: "For this is the will of God, that by doing good you

may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men."

2. A Lawyer \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus a Question – 22:35–36

"Then one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying, 'Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?'"
The "lawyer" here was not a courtroom attorney but a—an expert in the law.
"Lawyer – expert expounder of the Old Testament law. Equivalent to a degree in today."
The Pharisees believed that by continually questioning Jesus, He would eventually and say something they could use against Him.

3. Jesus Provided the Lawyer an 22:37-40
"Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.'
This is the first and commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.'"
A. Jesus Shares the Important Commandment – 22:37
"'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.'"
Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:5 — the, recited daily by Jews.

Practical ways to love your neighbor:

5. Jesus Makes a Profound Statement – 22:40
"On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."
The word "hang" ( <i>kremannymi</i> ) means to depend upon or be suspended from. Every other law in Scripture depends on these two:
<ul><li>Love God</li><li>Love others</li></ul>
"If you don't love God, obedience turns to If you don't love people, obedience becomes"
<b>Conclusion:</b> Mark adds the rest of the story (Mark 12:32–34), "Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth to love Him with all the heart, understanding, soul, and strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself is more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."
