

## Week Three Family Discussion Questions (June 20-26)

- 1) Read Exodus 2:1-10. What does the story about Moses' birth and rescue teach us about God's plan for Moses?
  - a) God has a plan for each of our lives even before we are born
  - b) God protects His people and can even use people who don't love Him (in this case, Egyptians) to do His will
  - c) God can deliver His people from even the most dangerous situations
  - d) All of the above
- 2) In Exodus 2:11-12, we learn that Moses kills an Egyptian. As you will read, God has a big plan for Moses' life, and He is certainly going to use Moses in a mighty way. Could Moses be the promised Messiah? (Why or Why not?)

3) In Numbers 20, we find that both Moses and the entire nation of Israel are a complaining and stubborn people who are guilty before holy God. However, God still blesses this sinful people with provision, and under Joshua's leadership, Israel will enter the Promised Land. What does this story teach us about God's faithfulness to His promises?

4)	In Joshua 1:1-9, God assures Joshua that He will be with him just as He was with Moses. He also promises, "Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, just as I promised to Moses." What did Joshua do to deserve these blessings? Could Joshua be the promised Messiah?
5)	What mistake does Joshua make in the story recorded in Joshua, chapter 9? (Hint: See verses 14-15.) Can you remember a time when you made a similar error, maybe even this week? If so, discuss the situation with your family.
6)	Joshua means "The Lord is Salvation." How does the life of Joshua point to the one true Savior, Jesus Christ?
