

## Week One Family Discussion Questions (June 6-12)

1) In	Genesis	1:26-31,	we learn	that God	made ma	n in his	own ima	ge. What	are

2) One answer to the previous question is that God desired a relationship with people from the beginning of creation. Based on your reading for this week, what do you think our relationship with God is supposed to look like?

3) Read Genesis 2:15-17 and Genesis 3:1-5. How is God's *good* command about the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil different from the way the Serpent and Eve try to explain it? What about their descriptions is wrong?

4) How do you respond when God tells you to do something that you don't want to do, or tells you <u>not</u> to do something that is wrong? How are we still like Adam and Eve today?
5) In Genesis 3:10, Adam admits he is afraid of God. How is this reaction different from the way God wanted to relate to Adam and Eve?
6) Even though Adam and Eve sinned and broke fellowship with God, God makes them a wonderful promise in Genesis 3:15. What is this promise? (Note: God is speaking directly to the serpent in this verse, but his promise is clearly for Adam, Eve, and their descendants.)
This Week's Key Verse: Genesis 3:15 "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."
