1 Corinthians 7:1-9

Corinth had a loose reputation. It was home to a massive temple to Aphorodite, the goddess of erotic love. Their "worship" employed several thousand temple prostitutes (men and women) whose earnings supported the cult of Aphrodite. The Roman Empire coined its own slang word for sexual immorality: kwringiazomai (corinthiazomai), to live like a Corinthian.

Big idea? We are to celebrate sex as part of the lifelong marriage of a man and a woman.

Paul accordingly offers several directives.

Directive #1: Avoid All Sexual Activity Outside of Biblical Marriage 1 Corinthians 7:1

He's talking about sexual activity outside marriage, which was considered normal. He offers this command for couple reasons.

- 1. Your sexual experiences and the associated images follow you throughout your life.
- 2. If you're a Christ-follower, then your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor 6:19). Jesus lives in you. So every time you have sex outside biblical marriage, you're making Jesus a participant in your sexual experiences.

We are to celebrate sex as part of the lifelong marriage of a man and a woman. Consequently, we are to avoid all sexual activity outside of a biblical marriage.

Directive #2: Regularly pursue sexual activity inside your marriage. 1 Corinthians 7:2-4

Sex is wonderful. The best way to experience it is for a husband and wife to become the exclusive student of the other in the safety and comfort of the marriage bed. Your duty is not just to have sex, but to <u>learn</u> what most

fulfills the other. We yield our bodies to one another to deepen, renew, and enrich our covenant relationship. But Paul teaches that sexual activity is neither recreational nor casual. It is a covenantal act that binds people together.

Genesis 2:24 That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh. The Hebrew word rendered "united" means to be "glued together." Which points to why <u>premarital</u> sex falls outside of God's plan. Premarital sex prematurely establishes a covenantal relationship that, if broken, inflicts painful damage.

There are times when it's appropriate for a couple to refrain from sex. But it should be strictly temporary and by mutual agreement. 1 Corinthians 7:5 2 primary reasons.

- 1. When you agree to abstain as a part of fasting and prayer.
- 2. Sometimes life just happens and there are too many distractions, health concerns, or stressful life circumstances.

Those times should be brief. To purposefully deprive your spouse of a fulfilling sex life is to make them a target of the tempter.

God invented sex. It is not shameful, but blessed. God uses it to strengthen marriages.

We are to celebrate sex as part of the lifelong marriage of a man and a woman. Paul next addresses the issue of singleness.1 Corinthians 7:6–9

III. Pursue Marriage If You Don't Have "The Gift of Singleness"

Paul refers to celibacy as a gift. He uses the term $\chi \dot{\alpha} \rho_{10} \sigma_{\mu} \alpha$ (*charisma*), from which we get the word, *charismatic*. It means "a gift given by grace". It is a spiritual gift whereby God imparts a supernatural degree of contentment to remain single. It then frees a person to focus on ministry without the distraction of a spouse and family duties.

If you long to marry, get your friends and small group members to pray for you. It's ok also to utilize technology to search for someone. But I also urge you to leverage your current state for the glory of God.

If you're going to be sexually active, choose godly actions and <u>ONLY</u> join your soul with the man or woman with whom you have established your marriage vows AND COVENANT BOND in the presence of God and witnesses. May God bless and enrich your marriage bed!
