HUMANITY

God loved us so much, that he sent his son to die for our sins. The THIRST that Jesus endured during his crucifixion allowed the prophecies of scripture to be fulfilled. Read and discuss the three reasons below to help you understand His Humanity.

It showed that Jesus was truly HUMAN.

Jesus was 100% God, but He was also 100% human at the same time. Besides His thirst, what were some of the human characteristics of Jesus we know about from scripture? Which ones do you relate to? How does Jesus being fully human impact our life? Our eternity?

Mark 15:23; Philippians 2:7-8; John 11:33-36; Luke 5:16

It showed that Jesus was the PROMISED SAVIOR.

Jesus is the only one who fulfills the hundreds of prophecies about the Messiah in scripture. He alone is our Savior! What are some other predictions you know from the Bible?

John 19:28; Psalm 69:21; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

It shows how much Jesus LOVES YOU.

Jesus covered us with His love. His thirst on the cross demonstrated love in action. Who do you know at your work, school, or even in your own family, who is spiritually thirsty? What can you do to share the love of Christ with them?

Amos 8:11-13

- **We serve Jesus by SERVING others.** (*Matthew 25:31-40*)
Are you serving others? If you serve, why do you do it?
- **Jesus applauds the LITTLE things.** (*Matthew 10:42*)
Where could you be making a difference? What is a need you could fill?
