Who is My Authority?

“The Lord God has told you what is good...”

Micah 6:8

If we love Him we will obey Him. God wants us to have the fullness of life. So He then becomes our compass for life's questions.

1. It begins with **Creation**.

Who does the world belong to? Who is in charge and has all authority?

Colossians 1: 15-18; Matthew 28:18; Colossians 2:6-10; Revelation 2:26; Matthew 9:8

2. It gets witnessed in **The Fall**.

The witness of the fall is man trying to be his own compass. Pastor Keith shared with us that a compass is fixated on an unchangeable force-the unchangeable God. How do we stop the compass from pointing to us and instead have it point to Him?

1 John 2:16; Romans 2:19-23; Galatians 6:3; Micah 6:8

“...to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God.”

Micah 6:8

God has made you to be a part of His creation and invited you into His Kingdom! We get to be His guests for all of eternity if we accept His invitation.

How do we live out the question of life's purpose for each one of us? What is the reward for staying obedient to Him-letting our compass point toward Him? What tools are readily available to us in keeping our focus in His direction?
