MONEY: IT'S A TRUST.

Discuss how the principle of stewardship applies to your life in general? To your finances? Would you (or do you) find it hard to trust God when money is scarce? How can we be faithful with what He has entrusted to us?

MONEY: IT'S A **TEST**.

How is your stewardship of money a test from God? How can we pass that test? What is God's reward for being faithful with that which He has entrusted to us?

- b. IT'S A BLESSING.
