The only things that aren't temporary in this world are Godly relationships. What legacy are you leaving behind through your relationships, both with God and with others?

We are each challenged to be God's man or woman where we are, and God will reveal His purpose for us. Do you think God has revealed what your legacy will be? How is leaving a Godly legacy unique to each of us?
