It's important that God's Word continues after the message. At Celebrate, we find that you will quite often talk over this week's message long after our experience is over. That's because God has impact. The Sermon Discussion Guide is designed to help you continue the conversation all week.

TRUST

As Jesus was dying on the cross, one of the roman soldiers said Jesus must have been the Son of God because of how different this crucifixion was because of the words of Jesus. Jesus gave up His life willingly and confidently so we can depend completely on His finished work to save us from sin.

How do we know that Jesus gave up His life **WILLINGLY**? *Matthew 26:39; John 10:18*

How **<u>CONFIDENT</u>** was Jesus about what He came to Earth to do and that He accomplished His mission? *John 6:38-40; 1 John 3:8; John 19:30*

Upon His death, who did Jesus ultimately **DEPEND** on? How should that encourage us to follow His example?

Psalm 31:5; Luke 23:44-47

What things can we learn from Jesus' final words to know that we have a Father who **LOVES** us? *Romans 5:8; 1 John 4:8-9; John 3:16*

How can we know we have a Father in Heaven who we can always **TRUST**? *Psalm 33:4; 2 Timothy 1:12*

How do we know we have a Father in Heaven who is **TAKING CARE** of things we can't see? *Job 23:9-10; Proverbs 3:5-6; 2 Corinthians 4:17-18*

How do we know we have a Father in Heaven who can handle <u>ANYTHING</u> we put in His hands? *Isaiah 62:3; Luke 1: 37; John 10:28-29*

God's hands are big enough to <u>BLESS ME</u>, strong enough to <u>SECURE ME</u>, and scarred enough to <u>NEVER FORGET ME</u>.
