

Key Theme of 1 Kings

The direction of a nation is determined by the condition of the heart.

When leaders honor God, the nation experiences blessing.

When leaders drift from God, the nation moves toward judgment.

Key Passages

1 Kings 10:23

Main Point

Solomon's reign represents the height of Israel's power, prosperity, and influence.

1 Kings 11:4

Main Point

Spiritual decline begins with a drifting heart.

1 Kings 1:1

Main Point

The book begins during a moment of weakness and leadership transition.

1 Kings 1:4

Main Point

David's final days remain honorable before God and the people.

The Division of the Kingdom

North: **Israel** under Jeroboam.

South: **Judah** loyal to the line of David.

Historical Timeline

597 B.C. — Jehoiachin exiled to Babylon.

586 B.C. — Jerusalem destroyed and Judah taken captive.

560 B.C. — Jehoiachin released from prison (last event recorded in Kings).

538 B.C. — Return from exile begins under Cyrus.

Main Lesson

The greatest threat to God's people is not external enemies.

The greatest danger is internal drift.

When the heart drifts from God, everything else eventually follows.

2. Why do you think the Bible emphasizes the condition of the heart when evaluating leaders?
3. What lessons can we learn from David's final days about faithfulness even in weakness?
