GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. How would you describe "living hope" to someone who had never heard the term?
- 2. Read 1 Peter 1:3, Romans 5:5, Hebrews 6:19. What does Peter mean by "living hope" and how does this hope differ from other forms of hope?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 1:3-4. How do you personally relate to the idea of "an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading"? What does this promise mean to you in your faith journey, especially in seasons of difficulty?
- 4. Read 1 Peter 1:6-7, 2 Corinthians 4:16-18, Philippians 4:4-7. In 1 Peter, believers are encouraged to "rejoice" even in the midst of suffering. How can we find joy in the midst of suffering or difficulties?
- 5. Think about a time when you encountered suffering or difficulties, and you drew closer to Jesus. What influenced you to draw closer versus pull away from Him?
- 6. Is there someone in your life currently facing difficulties that God might want you to encourage and walk alongside? Briefly share who it is and how you might do that.
