- 4. If people such as those in vss. 9-10 didn't exist, would the Law still be necessary? Why?
- 5. How does the Law point us to our need for Christ?
- 6. What are some ways you would know if you were falling into legalism or using the Law incorrectly? Do you recognize any of those characteristics in your life?
- 7. What is the connection between sound doctrine and godly living? Is it possible to have the latter without the former?
