GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. In what areas of your life does opposition cause you to try harder rather than calling it quits?
- 2. **Read Acts 17:1-3.** Why do you think Paul and Silas—after being mistreated, jailed, and asked to leave Philippi for teaching people about Christ—passed through two other towns in favor of stopping in Thessalonica (17:1)?
- 3. Read Acts 17:5-9. What accusations were made against Christians in Thessalonica? Should we expect to face resistance when we share the gospel with others? Why or why not?
- 4. When it comes to sharing your faith with others, does opposition cause you to persevere and keep sharing or to quit (or be more reluctant to share)? Why?
- 5. **Read Acts 17:10-14.** What characterized the Bereans' response to the gospel message that Paul shared with them? How do you think Paul felt about the eagerness of the Bereans, especially in light of the trouble he had received from the Thessalonians?
- 6. How can we as believers best respond when we are falsely accused or mistreated on account of our faith? How can we keep from becoming discouraged when we face hostility from those who oppose the message of Jesus?
