GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. All of us have defining moments that shape our identity or change the direction of our lives. Share about one of those.
- 2. **Read Exodus 12:1-10.** Why do you think it was important that the lamb be without blemish and one year old? What was the significance of the Israelites eating bitter herbs?
- 3. **Read Exodus 12:11.** How were the Israelites instructed to eat the Passover? What do you think was the significance of that?
- 4. **Read Exodus 12:43-51**. What was the condition for foreigners to be able to participate in the Passover? Why was that significant (see also Genesis 17:10-11)?
- 5. Read Exodus 12:2, 14, 17, 24. The Passover was a defining moment for the Israelites. God told them to center their lives around it by marking the beginning of the year with it in the creation of their calendar, and God repeatedly said how they were to mark this day forever. As Christians, two of the most significant days of our faith are Easter and Good Friday. How do you typically mark, celebrate, or remember those days? Do you place any extra emphasis upon them or do anything out of the ordinary? Why or why not?
- 6. Would you say you are more centered on Christ now than in the past? In other words, does your life revolve around Him more today than it did last week, last month, or last year?
- 7. What daily, weekly, and monthly routines reflect Christ and his importance in your life? What is one change you could begin to make to show the centrality of your faith in your life?
