

**GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

1. If you had to give a presentation about your life this past year, what would you be proud to share — and what would you want to improve?
2. Read Genesis 2:16–17 and Genesis 3:19. How does God's warning about death reveal that death was never part of His original design? What does this show about how sin distorts our relationship with God and the world?
3. Read 1 Peter 1:6–7 and 1 John 3:2–3. Our trials refine our faith, and the resurrection will complete God's work in us, making us like Christ. How does knowing God will finish His work shape how you live today?
4. Read John 11:25–26 and 1 Thessalonians 4:14. How does Jesus fulfilling this prophecy strengthen your confidence that life, not death, has the final word? How might this shape how you share hope with others?
5. Read Psalm 16:9–11 and Acts 2:24–32. How does Jesus fulfilling this prophecy through His resurrection strengthen your confidence that life, not death, has the final word? How can this promise of resurrection shape the way you share the hope of Jesus with those around you?
6. 2 Corinthians 5:9–10 calls us to live for Christ, knowing we will one day appear before His judgment seat. "How does this encourage you to live intentionally today, trusting God's grace? What is one step you can take this week to grow in love, faithfulness, or service?"
7. Because Jesus' resurrection makes all things new, how can your life reflect His victory over sin and death this week? What's one practical way you can bring hope, forgiveness, or renewal to someone else?

Memorize:

John 11:25–26

Jesus said to her, I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?
