GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. Describe a time you really let someone down or disappointed them, and then experiences their forgiveness and acceptance. How did this affect you?
- 2. **Read Luke 5:1-11.** Considering Peter's experience in John 21:1-14, share some of your observations about these two scenes in the life of Peter. Why the miraculous filling of the nets? What are some of the lessons you can draw from these two scenes?
- 3. Peter went back to fishing after disowning Christ. What does this reveal about how he felt concerning God's plan for his life? How does this encourage you regarding God's plans for our lives?
- 4. Why do you think Peter was the first one to leave the boat and the enormous catch to go meet with Jesus? How can Peter's response help us when we sin, backslide, or simply just fail?
- 5. **Read Luke 15:11-32** (Parable of the Prodigal or Lost Son). Describe the father's response to the son after he repented from his life of "wild living" in verses 20-24. How does this reflect our Father's response and Jesus' response to Peter? Notice there is a meal involved in both. What might be the significance of that?
- 6. **Read Galatians 6:1.** Describe how we are to deal with others who are either in sin or backsliding? What might this look like? What does it mean by "those who are spiritual"?
- 7. What did you learn in today's discussion about Peter and Jesus? Are there some characteristics from either we can emulate in our relationship with God and other people?
