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GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. "I don't get mad; I get even." What might be the outcome of such an approach to conflict-resolution? Do you take this approach more often or less than you have in the past?
- 2. What may have been some reasons in the past for long-standing, unresolved conflicts between you and friends/family members? How were you able to get past them? If those barriers still exist, why do you think that is?
- 3. **Read 1 Samuel 25.** What was the nature of the offense to David and how did he intend to handle it? How did he choose instead to "take responsibility" for it? Why did he change his mind? Afterwards, how did God Himself take responsibility for the offense?
- 4. Read Ephesians 4:31, Hebrews 12:14-15, 1 Peter 3:7. What are some results of unresolved offenses between believers?
- 5. In his message, Pastor Greg said there is always a place where we need to take responsibility when offended. Where do you need to do that with your offense an offense of another?
- 6. If God's character ought to be the standard against which our lives and attitudes are measured, how ought we to respond to offenses? See Ephesians 4:32; Romans 5:8-10; 2 Corinthians 5:19; Matthew 5:24 and 18:15-17.
- 7. Prayerfully consider this week if there are unaddressed offenses in your life corroding your relationships with God and others. Ask God what He wants you to do with them. If one comes to mind, and it's appropriate, share it with your group so they can pray for you and what your responsibility is with it.
