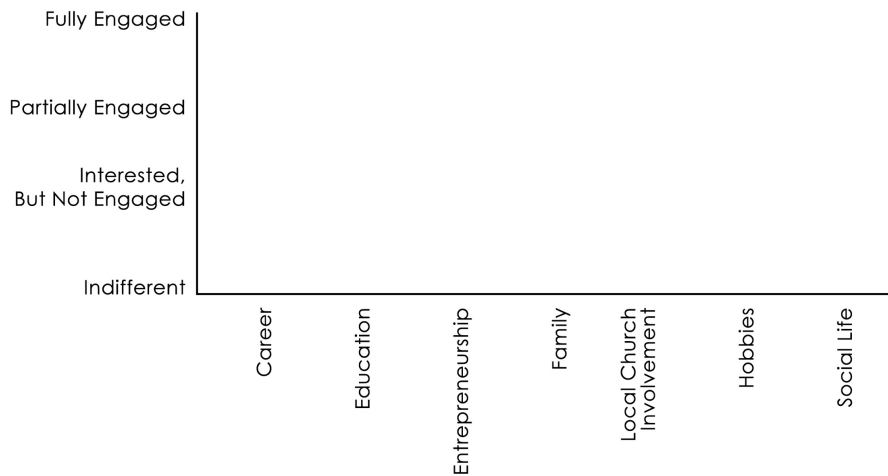




**Discussion Starter**
