

WISDOM FOR RAISING OUR CHILDREN

*“I guide you in the way of wisdom and lead you along straight paths.”
—PROVERBS 4:11*

When the Hebrew people crossed the Red Sea into freedom, they became a nation that needed to be re-established and governed. On Mount Sinai, God gave Moses the Ten Commandments in order to reveal His moral character, which then served as laws to govern the people.
