Psalm 88:1-2, 6-18

SOME TRUTHS ABOUT DARKNESS

1. Both spiritual and personal darkness can last a very **LONG** time.

Two Kinds of Darkness:

- OUTSIDE darkness is the darkness of CIRCUMSTANCES.
- <u>INTERNAL</u> darkness is <u>SPIRITUAL</u> darkness.

(Romans 8:28, 1 Corinthians 13:12)?

- 2. Darkness can show you God's **GRACE**.
- 3. Darkness can turn you into someone **GREAT**.

(Job 1:8-9)

- a. As bad as this psalm looks, as much as this guy seems to be really blowing it in how he's relating to God... he's still doing it all, **BEFORE GOD**.
- b. If you make the choice to remain "before God," even in suffering, then you have defeated **SATAN'S** scheme, and are becoming a person of unshakeable **CHARACTER**.
- 4. Darkness can be **RELATIVIZED**.
 - a. The darkness he felt was not absolute, total, and permanent. It wasn't **objective**; it was **SUBJECTIVE**. It was apparent; it wasn't his ultimate reality.

GOD IN THE DARK

Why did Jesus experience total darkness on our behalf? Because God wants to **FORGIVE** us.

If Jesus Christ didn't abandon you in <u>HIS</u> darkness, the ultimate darkness, why in the world would he abandon you in <u>YOURS</u>?

Psalm 88:1-2, 6-18

- ¹ O LORD, the God who saves me, day and night I cry out before you.
- ² May my prayer come before you; turn your ear to my cry.
- ⁶ You have put me in the lowest pit, in the darkest depths.
- ⁷ Your wrath lies heavily upon me; you have overwhelmed me with all your waves.
- ⁸ You have taken from me my closest friends and have made me repulsive to them.

I am confined and cannot escape;

⁹ my eyes are dim with grief.
 I call to you, O LORD, every day;
 I spread out my hands to you.

¹⁰ Do you show your wonders to the dead?

Do those who are dead rise up and praise you?

¹¹ Is your love declared in the grave, your faithfulness in Destruction?

¹² Are your wonders known in the place of darkness, or your righteous deeds in the land of oblivion?

¹³ But I cry to you for help, O LORD;

in the morning my prayer comes before you.

¹⁴ Why, O LORD, do you reject me and hide your face from me?

¹⁵ From my youth I have been afflicted and close to death; I have suffered your terrors and am in despair.

¹⁶ Your wrath has swept over me; your terrors have destroyed me.

¹⁷ All day long they surround me like a flood; they have completely engulfed me.

¹⁸ You have taken my companions and loved ones from me; the darkness is my closest friend.
