JAMES 1:1-11

James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes scattered among the nations: Greetings.

² Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ⁴ Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. ⁶ But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. ⁷ That person should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. ⁸ Such a person is double-minded and unstable in all they do.

⁹ Believers in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position.¹⁰ But the rich should take pride in their humiliation—since they will pass away like a wild flower. ¹¹ For the sun rises with scorching heat and withers the plant; its blossom falls and its beauty is destroyed. In the same way, the rich will fade away even while they go about their business.

- A <u>believer</u> and receiver of <u>salvation</u> from God (John 3:16-18, Romans 5:8-9)
- Living by the Holy Spirit (Romans 8:1-16, Galatians 5:13-25)
- Abiding in **Christ** (John 15:4-7)
 - Make Christ the <u>main</u> thing

TRIALS

THE POWER OF PERSPECTIVE

- Heaven as home (Romans 8:18, I Peter 2:9-11)
- Expecting <u>hardship</u> based on a <u>realistic</u> and <u>Biblical</u> view of the earth's brokenness (Romans 8:19-25, John 16:33, I Peter 5:8-11)
- Anticipation of what the trial will <u>produce</u> in *your* life and in the *world*. (James 1:3-4, Hebrews 12:1-3, Romans 5:1-5)
- Perseverance as an act of worship

THE POWER OF HOPE

- Eternity (I Thessalonians 4:13)
- Measuring our life's <u>value</u> on what <u>God</u> gives, not devastated by what the world does not give.

WISDOM

- You can't receive the wisdom of God if you <u>doubt</u> the God <u>offering</u> you the wisdom.
- If you want to be <u>empowered</u> by the wisdom of God, you have to place your confidence in God, His wisdom and His way. This is the heart attitude and action of exchanging of our self-confidence apart from God for <u>belief</u> and <u>reliance</u> on Him. (I Cor 1:18-25)

ETERNAL MINDSET

SEE YOURSELF THROUGH THE GOSPEL

- Those with <u>low</u> social status, power and resources, are elevated by Christ and recipients of an eternal inheritance that makes them spiritually <u>rich</u>.
- Those whose value is rooted in social status, power and resources in this life are brought low by the deceitfulness of wealth and the brevity of mortality.
- Only things having <u>eternal</u> <u>value</u> last.
