RESEARCH FROM GORDON CONWELL THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

The Center for the Study of Global Christianity at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary estimates that more than 70 million Christians have been martyred over the last 2,000 years. *More than half* of these were in the 20th century, mostly under fascist and communist regimes. For the early 21st century, they estimate that 1 million Christians were killed over the 10-year period from 2000–2010, an average of approximately 100,000 Christians killed each year.

STATISTIC FROM WYCLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS

According to Wycliffe Bible translators, there are 6,877 known languages. Shockingly, there are only 683 complete Bible translations. That does represent a majority of the world, but it means that there are still more than 2163 languages, spoken today, with NO Bible translation.

The things listed here are **GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS** of this present age, and the "birth pains" that we live in.

- Until Jesus returns, there will be <u>FALSE</u> messiahs.
- Until Jesus returns, there will be repeated WARFARE.
- Until Jesus returns, there will be **BIRTH PAINS**.

WHAT DISCIPLES SHOULD EXPECT

- Jesus' followers should expect PERSECUTION.
- Jesus' followers should expect **BETRAYAL**.
- Jesus' followers should expect <u>DECEPTION</u>.
- Jesus' followers should expect <u>WICKEDNESS</u> and LOVELESSNESS.

A disciple's real commitment to Jesus is demonstrated in whether he or she remains **STEADFAST**.

THE END TO COME

- Jesus predicts the destruction of Jerusalem and the <u>TEMPLE</u>, and a future abomination that causes desolation that will lead God's people <u>ASTRAY</u> bringing destruction on all who resist.
- Christ will return, and it will be <u>PERSONAL</u>, it will be <u>VISIBLE</u>, it will be <u>GLORIOUS</u>, and it some way it will be <u>UNIVERSAL</u>.

BOTTOM LINE

- The kingdom of God will <u>PREVAIL</u>, and therefore you can continue to be <u>OBEDIENT</u> in the midst of suffering.
