Topic: Don't Waste Your Life	Speaker: Pastor Joe Ong

WELCOME

A popular saying in culture for a while was "YOLO" or "You Only Live Once." This is true, each of us will only have one life on this Earth. This week we will examine how we can ensure that we don't waste it.

For the ice breaker this week, share your answers to the following question: Sum up your morning in a single word. Why that word?

WORSHIP

Start the worship time by encouraging people to share praises for what God has done in their life this past week. Sing worship songs from the Sunday services or select your own.

WORD

- I. Spiritual Objective. At the end of the discussion, members will:
 - **A.** Discuss what selfless devotion is and what it looks like to live a life of selfless devotion.
 - **B.** Talk about where selfless devotion comes from and the action it should result in.

II. The Sermon Synopsis:

When Jesus was over at the house of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha, Mary took a jar of expensive perfume and anointed Jesus' feet with it. One of the disciples, Judas, objected as to why the perfume wasn't sold and the money used for the poor. Jesus' response is a reminder that Kingdom thinking does not always align with worldly thinking.

Instead of agreeing with Judas, Jesus acknowledges that Mary has done a good thing. Often this world will tell us that our actions, our sacrifices for the Lord do not make sense. However, the Kingdom of God does not work according to our expectations. When we commit ourselves in selfless devotions to Christ we may find the price costly, but our lives will never be wasted.

The Text:

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus lived, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honor. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with him. ³ Then Mary took about a pint^[a] of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. ⁴ But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray him, objected, ⁵ "Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages."

(John 12:1-5 NIV)

Discussion Questions

- **III.** Pastor Joe made the statement that our lives will not be wasted if you spend it in selfless devotion to Jesus. What do you feel like you are living for? What makes you get up in the morning?
- **IV.** Pastor Joe used the word selfless devotion throughout His sermon. *How would you define "selfless devotion"?* Selfless devotion will look different for each of us. *What does selfless devotion look like for you? How is it different for others?*
- **V.** Following Jesus is not always easy, in fact the Bible clearly says that following Jesus will come at a cost to every person. What has following Jesus cost you in your life? How has it been difficult? Is it worth it? Why?
- **VI.** Selfless devotion comes from a variety of places, love for Christ, gratitude, and knowing Christ personally. What do you find motivates your actions most often? Do you act out of love or a sense of obligation? What do you have to be grateful to God for?
- **VII.** When we are selflessly devoted to Christ, the natural result is action; we will naturally serve God and others; witness and share the Gospel with others; our lives will naturally begin to adopt the



fragrance of the fruit of the spirit. What does your fragrance smell like? Does it reflect the fruit of the Spirit? (Love, Peace, Joy, etc.)

WORK

- ➤ <u>Pray</u> and ask God to develop that desire to serve Him selflessly. Ask for opportunities to serve Him and express that selfless devotion to God and others. Finally thank Him that our lives are not wasted and that we can have confidence in Him and in His work.

7 "Leave her alone," Jesus replied. "It was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of my burial. 8 You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me." 9 Meanwhile a large crowd of Jews found out that Jesus was there and came, not only because of him but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. 10 So the chief priests made plans to kill Lazarus as well, 11 for on account of him many of the Jews were going over to Jesus and believing in him.
