Topic: Peter the Impulsive Disciple	Speaker: Dr. George Rhoades

#### WELCOME

Dr. Rhoades continues to look at characters within the Bible and how God used them for His glory. This week we look at Peter, his impulsiveness, and how his life glorified God.

For the ice breaker this week, share your answers to the following question: What is your favorite Christmas song?

## WORSHIP

Start the worship time by encouraging people to share praises for what God has done in their life this past week. Sing worship songs from the Sunday services or select your own.

### WORD

- I. Spiritual Objective. At the end of the discussion, members will:
  - **A.** Discuss how Peter's background was used by God for His glory and the establishment of the Church.
  - **B.** Talk about how we can spend time with Jesus and study God's Word to guide our actions and lives.

## **II.** The Sermon Synopsis:

Peter is often known as the impulsive disciple and we see many examples in Scripture of Peter speaking or acting quickly. Sometimes Peter's impulsiveness got him into trouble, sometimes it benefited him. Before following Jesus, Peter was a fisherman, who were often gruff, loud, vulgar, and full of confidence. Peter would go on to become one of the leaders of the disciples, and eventually lead the early Church in Jerusalem.

By spending time with Jesus, Peter was able to gain the confidence necessary to be the leader he became. He also followed the example Christ had set for him, kept focused on Jesus, and was filled with and trusted the Holy Spirit. Peter serves as another reminder that God uses all people and personalities. What is important is that we spend time with and learn from Christ.

### **The Text:**

21 From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life. <sup>22</sup> Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!" <sup>23</sup> Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

### (Matthew 16:21-23)

13 When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. 14 But since they could see the man who had been healed standing there with them, there was nothing they could say. (Acts 4:13-14)

### **Discussion Questions**

- III. Before being called by Jesus Peter was a fisherman. Like many of the disciples, Peter's background made it surprising that he would help spread the church across the world. How can God use just anyone regardless of who or what they were? Have you ever felt that God cannot use you because of your past or your lack of gifts or talents? How has he used you anyway?
- **IV.** Dr. Rhoades highlighted the times where Peter's impulsiveness got him into trouble and when it worked well in his favor. What is your own personality like? Are you impulsive and think things out thoroughly before acting? What are the pluses and minuses? How can God use your personality?
- **V.** One of the most well known stories of Peter is of him walking on the water towards Jesus. However, he became distracted by the storm, took his eyes of Jesus, and began to sink. What distractions in life causes us to take our eyes off Jesus and sink? How can we stay focused and keep our eyes of Christ?



- **VI.** Peter had confidence to lead the Early Church because of the time he had spent with Jesus. The more time we spend with Jesus, the more we learn to hear His voice, the more confident we become in our actions, and the greater things we do for the Kingdom. What does it mean to spend time with Jesus? How do you spend time with Him? Do you have confidence in Christ? Do you feel as if He is calling or asking you to do something?
- VII. One of the ways to deal with impulsiveness is to follow the example of Jesus. A popular statement a few years ago was WWJD or What Would Jesus Do. Besides spending time with Jesus, we know more about Jesus by studying Scripture. How does Scripture reveal more about Jesus? What is the difference between studying Scripture and reading it? In what areas do you ask yourself, "What would Jesus do?" In what areas of your life do you tend to do your own thing because of the confidence you already have in yourself?
