



Consider One Another – Hebrews 10:23-25 August 18, 2019

Read and Examine – As you read the passage together consider these questions:

- Read Hebrews 10:23-25.
- In your own words what is the main point of the passage?
- What do we learn about Jesus in this passage?

Apply – Consider how God intends this passage to shape your life.

- What all do you think happens when a local body of believers gathers for worship? How important is gathering with the church on a regular basis to you? How does your participation in the corporate worship of a local church encourage your growth in Christ? How does your lack of participation in the gathering of the body hurt the rest of the body?
- What do you think it means to “consider one another”? How do you see an intentional consideration of each other in your CG playing itself out? What has been the fruit of that? How could you be more intentional to consider one another?
- How can you intentionally stir up someone in your CG to love and good works? How has God used people in your life to stir you up to love and good works?
- How does Christ being our treasure free us to live for the good and growth of others not begrudgingly but with joy?
- Read Hebrews 3:12-14. How does God use other brothers and sisters in Christ in our lives to keep us believing the gospel? What is the danger of neglecting to meet together or not really being known by those in your local church?
- How does a CG that intentionally considers one another in the midst of those that don’t know Jesus adorn the gospel message that they articulate?
- What is something that really stood out to you in this passage/sermon?

Pray – You’ve been hearing from God in his word now respond to him in prayer

- Thank God for the way he uses others in your life to grow you in Christlikeness and keep you faithful to the end.
- Ask God to use you this week to stir up others to love and good deeds.
