forgiving us.

Heb. 12:14 - 'pursue peace with all people'

Rom. 12:18 - 'as much as it depends on you  
be at peace with everyone'

Matt 18:15 - 'If your brother sins against you...  
go to him in private'

Matt 5:23-24 - if you realize someone has something  
against you... go to them'

If Christians are easily offended or injured by every one, we can be rendered totally ineffective.

Forgiveness ...

a. is not forgetting what happened

*Jeremiah 31:34*

*For I will forgive their wickedness and will  
remember their sins no more.*

Forgiveness...

b. is not always about reconciliation or peace  
at all cost.

‘convict’ (Jude 15)

‘rebuke’ (2 Tim. 4:2)

‘admonish’ (Rom. 15:14)

‘resist’ or ‘oppose’ (Gal 2:11)

‘solemnly charge’ (2 Tim. 2:14)

‘contend earnestly’ (Jude 3)

‘tell the person their fault’ (Matt 18)
