Romans 12:1-2 | Psalm 100 | Philippians 2:9-11 | Psalm 150

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. When you think of God, what is the first thing that comes to mind? When most non-believers think of God, what do they generally conclude about Him?
- 2. Psalm 8 gives us a vision of God with two clear, compelling reasons to worship Him in any season, at any time and in any circumstance. Both have everything to do with God and who He is and what He has done. In your life, how do you praise and worship God for who He is and what He has done? In verses 1 & 9, what is significant about God's name that reminds us that He is worthy of our praise and worship?
- 3. God is in full control of all things, and all things are under His feet (Heb 2:8-9). He invites us to worship Him in our greatest weakness and highest dependence ("babies and infants") and, in so doing, find His strength that is greater than any and every foe. What is the highest form of worship?
- 4. We worship God for the staggering enormity of His creation (v.3). How does God's creation reveal His greatness? According to Genesis 1:14-19, how were the heavens created? How great is our God?
- 5. We worship God for His stunning love and grace for humanity (vv. 4-7). "What is man that you are mindful of him;" God is enormous, made the heavens and earth, all for His glory, yet He is mindful of us. How do you feel knowing that God is "mindful" of you? What importance has God placed on man? Does Genesis 1:26-27 give you reason to praise God? If so, in what ways can you specifically praise Him?
- 6. At the end of his message, Pastor Jay encouraged CG members and guests to worship God for His staggering creation and His stunning love and grace. What does that look like as a local body of believers? What does that look like to you individually?
