

Scriptures for further study Isaiah 40 | Psalm 103 | Hebrews 10:24-25

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Psalm 92:1-4

1 It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High; 2 to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night, 3 to the music of the lute and the harp, to the melody of the lyre. 4 For you, O Lord, have made me glad by your work; at the works of your hands I sing for joy.

- Asking "why?" has a glorious tradition. Examining our worship means asking the right questions of ourselves. Why am I here? Why am I in church today? Why am I doing what I'm doing? Why do I attend church each Sunday? What does the way I worship say about God? What does my worship say about how I see God?
- 2. We know to worship God, and God alone. However, we often get off track and worship the creation and not the creator. According to verse 1, "it is good to give thanks to the Lord." What are some ways we give thanks to the Lord? What does it mean to sing praises to His name? How do we separate worshipping God as opposed to worshipping His creation?
- 3. Why do we often equate worship with Sunday and no other time? What does verse 2 say we are to declare? What does this look like in your personal spiritual journey?
- 4. According to verse 3, what are some ways to worship? What is the posture of worship? Worship should include our "whole being." Jesus said, "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength." How do we worship God with our heart? Soul? Mind? Strength?
- 5. How does worship change us according to verse 4? How has God made you glad by His work? In your own words, what is joy? Why do you sing for joy? How do you sing for joy?
- 6. What can you do this week to experience the full expression of Psalm 92:1-4?
