# 1. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Gethsemane (*Mark 14:32*)

The battle for the cross was waged in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus toiled under the weight of what was about to happen. And in absolute submission to the will of His Father, the Son of God surrendered His life to redeem all who will believe. The victory of the cross was won in the garden.

And being in agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. ~ Luke 22:44

# 2. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ at Gabbatha (John 19:13)

The surrendered King of kings was placed before the wicked judgment of men and condemned in a trial that was more show than substance. And such is the love of Christ—the Righteous One receiving the condemnation from the wicked so that He could take upon Himself the condemnation of the wicked.

Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You have said so." But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he gave no answer. ~ Matthew 27:11-12

## 3. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ on Golgotha (*Matthew 27:33-35*)

Jesus suffered on the cross the excruciating judgment of His Father. Poured out in full measure, Jesus received the wrath that we deserved. The Eternal one suffered so that all who believe on Him could be free from eternal judgment.

And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" ~ Mark 15:34
