# 1. Two \_\_\_\_\_ Experiences

Either destructive people or devastating calamities may come into the human experience. If we look at it from only our vantage point we will fail to see that God is ultimately sovereign over even these.

But as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities. ~ 2 Corinthians 6:4

#### 2. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Humanity

All mankind has two parallel problems: we are sinners, and we are debtors. All have missed the mark of God and are in a untenable situation: the debt we owe we cannot pay.

3. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Repent

Jesus, in His warning, is telling all who are willing to listen what it takes to settle accounts with the Judge. This call to repent is the cry of the gospel for all who know themselves to be a sinner/debtor before God.

As it is, I rejoice, not because you were grieved, but because you were grieved into repenting. For you felt a godly grief, so that you suffered no loss through us. ~ 2 Corinthians 7:9
