JOSHUA: EXTREME HERO “Never Forget”



“I Won’t Forget What God Has Done For Me!”



“But then I recall all you have done, O Lord; I remember your wonderful deeds of long ago.” – Psalm 77:11

SAY:

There are a lot of things that can cause a LOT of danger and trouble if they are forgotten. If you forget to turn off the stove, you could burn your house down. If you forget to eat, you could get sick. If you forget to drink water, you could become dehydrated. If you forget your wallet at the restaurant, your money could be stolen. In this Bible Story, we are going to learn the danger of forgetting what God has done for us.

READ:

Joshua 3:14 - 4:9

DISCUSS:

- What was the name of the river that Joshua had to cross?
- Why was the Jordan River so hard to cross?
- What happened the moment the priests got their feet into the water?
- What did Joshua instruct men to pick up on their way across?
- How many stones did the Israelites include in the altar?

SAY:

We learn from this story of Joshua and the altar made of 12 stones how important and powerful it is to remember what God has done for us! When we remember what God has done in the past, it gives us faith for what He can do in the future. That is why we should never forget!

PRAY:

Pray for your children who may be facing “impossible” situations in their lives. Ask them to remember what God has done for them in the past and begin to thank God for it. Then, believe that God will do it again.
