

"Don't Lift Your Sword, Lift Your Hands"



"When I'm In A Battle, I Will Worship The Lord!"

"...'Do not be afraid! Don't be discouraged by this mighty army, for the battle is not yours, but God's." – 2 Chronicles 20:15

READ:

2 Chronicles 20

DISCUSS:

- What was the name of the king of Israel in this story?
- How many armies were going to attack the Israelites?
- Who did King Jehoshaphat ask for advice?
- Who did the Israelites put out on the front line of the army?
- Who did the three armies end up fighting against?

SAY:

When King Jehoshaphat was faced with impossible odds (three armies versus his one), he knew God was the only One who could win the battle for him.

Because of this, he sent the worship choir out ahead of the soldiers. They arrived worshiping God and ended up seeing all three armies lying there dead. God had won the victory through worship.

Often, we face impossible odds. We could freak out. We could worry, but what we should do is what Jehoshaphat and his army of worshipers did. We should "turn our eyes upon Jesus" and begin to worship the only One who is going to be able to bring us the victory. The battle is the Lord's!

WORSHIP/PRAY:

Spend some time singing songs of worship with your children. Feel free to play some worship music your children will engage with. Spend time in prayer, thanking God for winning the battle and bringing the victory.
