

Hebrews: The Incomparable Christ





Unbelief leads us into disobedience and then leaves us in a state of unrest.



Rest = 12x in Hebrews, 10x in chapter 4

Enter = 12x in Hebrews, 6x in chapter 4

Promise = 52x in NT & Hebrews; 4:1 is first of 17x in book of Hebrews

The Bible speaks of rest in several different ways:

- Divine rest after Creation event
- Sabbath rest as the rhythm of life
- Homecoming rest returning to the Promised Land
- Spiritual rest "in Christ"
- Eternal rest in New Heavens and New Earth

1. There remains the promise of God's rest.

"When we stop building our identity on career, or our race, or our family, or any other created thing and rest in God, the fears and drives that enslaved us recede, and we experience a new freedom and security."

2. We must trust Christ to enter God's rest.

"Anxiety is only the context for sin, not its cause.
Our base problem is unbelief. Failing to trust
the infinite God, we live anxiously, restlessly, always
trying to secure and extend ourselves with finite
goods that can't take the weight we put on them."
