What is real?	■ The Biblical Social Justice worldview grounds the starting point or ultimate reality in the God who created the heavens and the earth. Nothing exists or makes sense apart from Him. (Colossians 1:16-17).	<ul> <li>Reality is grounded in the human mind.</li> <li>Subjective human perception has god-like authority.</li> </ul>

	Biblical Social Justice	Ideological Social Justice
Who are we?	<ul> <li>We are creations of a holy, good, and loving God.</li> <li>Both male and female are made in His image and likeness, with intrinsic dignity and worth (Genesis 1:26-27).</li> <li>Every individual is important but will be held individually accountable for all beliefs and actions (Hebrews 4:13).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Identity is derived entirely from "horizontal" relationships to other people and demographic groups.</li> <li>Identity is entirely socially constructed by the group(s) we belong to (there is no "individual" identity).</li> </ul>

	Biblical Social Justice	Ideological Social Justice
Who are we?	<ul> <li>The groups we belong to shape us but they do not define us.</li> <li>God has broken down all the barriers that divided us from himself and from each other. (Galatians 3:26-28)</li> <li>Treasuring God above all else recalibrates all other affections.</li> <li>Fighting injustice is rooted in the truth that every human is an image bearer of God, with worth and dignity (not related to social construction of identity).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Segregates people into competing tribes in a power struggle between the oppressor and the oppressed.</li> <li>No basis for unity other than shared oppressions or allies to that oppression.</li> </ul>

Christians must seek justice and see everyone (those you agree with and those you don't) as image bearers; you cannot pursue biblical justice without this heart posture.
